To award a construction contract to Granite Construction Company, in the amount of \$4,668,436 for the construction of Date Palm Drive Pavement Rehabilitation Project and approve a 8 percent (8%) contingency in the amount of \$401,564.00 for any unforeseeable construction costs that may be incurred, thereby, bringing the total construction budget for this Project to \$5,070,000.00; and approve the allocations of available FY 2023/2024 Tribal Transportation Program (TTP) Funds from the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians (ACBCI) in the amount of \$5,000,000; available FY 2023/2024 Cal-Recycle Grant Funds in the amount of \$70,000 for the construction of the Project; and, authorize the City Manager to execute the required contract documents (attached); and, to authorize the City Engineer to request bonds and insurance for the Project and to issue the Notice to Proceed.

F. Award Contract to Granite Construction Company for City-Wide Repaving Projects

Recommendation:

For the City Council to:

- (i) Award a construction contract to Granite Construction Company, in the amount of \$970,221.00 for the construction of the East Palm Canyon Drive Pavement Rehabilitation Project (C08669), Da Vall Street Improvements (C08665), San Eljay Pavement Rehabilitation (C08667), and the Public Alley Reconstruction Project (C08670); and
- (ii) Approve a contingency in the amount of \$97,022.10 for any unforeseeable construction costs; thereby, bringing the total construction budget for these Projects to \$1,067,243.10; and
- (iii) Approve the allocation of available FY 2023-2024 CIP Unidentified General Funds (MOE) from account 100-100-150-156-8800-8802 in the amount of \$147,282.50 for the construction of the Da Vall Street Improvements (C08665) and Public Alley Reconstruction Projects; and
- (iv) Approve the allocation of available Measure A Funds from account 243-100-150-156-8800-8802 for the construction of East Palm Canyon Pavement Rehabilitation (C08669) and Da Vall Street Improvements (C08665) in the amount of \$541,829.00; and
- (v) Approved the allocation of available Assessment District 86-5 Funds from account 344-100-150-156-8800-8802 for the construction of San Eljay Pavement Rehabilitation (C08667) in the amount of \$378,131.60; and

Authorize the City Manager to execute the required (vi) contract documents; and authorize the City Engineer to request bonds and insurance for the Project and issue the Notice to Proceed.

G. Consulting Agreement for Christiansen and Co. for Engineering Land **Development Management Support**

Recommendation: To approve a Professional Services Agreement with Christiansen & Company to provide Land Development Engineering Support Management Consulting Services for the not to exceed total of \$93,000; and authorize the City Manager to execute the Agreement.

Recommendation:

To approve the updated and proposed revisions to the City's WaterSmart Landscapes Grant Program (Program). including increases to Program rebates for individual properties up to \$1,000 and adding Homeowners Associations (HOAs) into the Program with rebates up to \$20,000, with herein detailed parameters for the Program; and, direct Staff to amend the Program grant application materials to reflect said revisions and send out notifications to property owners and HOAs within the City regarding changes to the Program.
