Bagged food waste, Birds of Paradise, dead plants, expired food, flowers, food soiled paper, grass clippings, leaves, prunings, shrub trimmings, small branches (under 4'), twigs, untreated wood, weeds Plastics #1-7, empty food cartons, empty glass bottles & jars, empty cans (aerosol, aluminum, tin), clean paper (cardboard, envelopes, junk mail, magazines, newspaper, pizza boxes, wrapping paper)

Animal waste, clothing, diapers, dishware, hoses, flower pots, plastic bags, plastic toys, plastic utensils, shrink wrap, straws, window glass, wipes

#### SB 1383 and Your Property

As of January 1, 2022, California state law Senate Bill (3B) 1383 Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Strategy, requires all businesses, residents, and multi-family properties to separate organic materials (such as plant debris, food waste, food-soiled papers, untreated wood waste) and recyclable materials from trash, and subscribe to the required collection services, as well as manage all landscaping debris generated at the site.

FAQ for Property Manager/Owner
What do I need to do to comply with SB 1383? Property owners/
managers are required to:

Provide organics collection services for their employees and tenants.
Supply and allow access to an adequate number, size, and location
of containers with the correct labels and container colors.

Annually educate employees and tenants on property sorting
organic waste into the correct bins.

Provide information to new tenants within 14 days of occupancy.

#### **MULTIFAMILY** PROGRAMS

Property Managers can arrange for tenants to properly dispose of bulky items, such as appliances, E-waste, furniture, and similar large items, for free through Burrtec Waste and Recycling.

#### **HHW PICKUP**

(HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE)

Property Managers can arrange for tenants to recycle their electronics and household hazardous waste at no additional charge through Burrtec Waste and Recycling. Battery collection is included. However, batteries must be taped on both ends. or they will not be collected.

\*Must be coordinated by Property Manager/Owner.





#### STATE LAW AB 827 Front-of-House

## Waste Collection

Effective 2020, MCR and MORe covered businesses must provide organics and recycling containers at front-of-house to collect waste generated from products purchased and consumed on the premises.

This law impacts businesses that sell products meant for immediate consumption, full-service restaurants do not have to provide containers for patrons.



Please contact our office to correct your account.



 3. Please place containers in the street with wheels next to the curb/property line. Containers must be placed three feet from parked vehicles or other obstructions.



4. Discarded materials must be placed in the appropriate container. Trimmings may be bundled but no longer than 48 inches and a diameter of less than 24 inches.



 Excess material. Do not stack on top of these containers. Call for an extra pickup in the future.







 Bulky, large, or special item collection is required. Please contact our office.



7. Container too heavy to lift.



Unpermitted waste such as household hazardous waste, chemicals, batteries, electronics, paint, or fluorescent light tubes were placed in the container. Contact your local office.

Bill Insert Messages 2024

Quarter 1 – January billing Date (February Invoice)

SB 1383 requires your business to subscribe to and participate in their jurisdiction's organics collection. Employees, contractors, tenants, and customers must properly sort organic materials into the correct containers at business establishments.

**Quarter 2- March billing Date (April Invoice)** 

Mandatory organic waste recycling is the next step toward achieving California's aggressive recycling goals. California disposes approximately 30 million tons of waste in landfills yearly, of which more than 30 percent could be used for compost or mulch.

**Quarter 3- August billing Date (September invoice)** 

SB 1383 requires covered AB 827 generators to have collection containers at the front of the house to be visible, easily accessible, and clearly marked. This law targets businesses that sell products meant for immediate consumption. Contact Burrtec for your free labels.

**Quarter 4- October billing Date (November invoice)** 

To reduce contamination, businesses must educate employees, contractors, tenants, and customers on sorting material into the correct containers. Businesses must periodically Inspect, Instruct, and Inform employees about contamination.
